Course Description and Objectives:

The evening class Level 1B is the continuation of 1A Beginning Chinese. This class is an introduction to Mandarin Chinese for speakers of English with no knowledge of the language. Focus is on developing students' speaking and listening abilities to handle most common situations in daily life in China. Based on the needs of the students, the instructor will also teach Chinese writing and introduce Chinese culture. This course is suited for anyone who plans to visit China, exploring the Chinese market, or simply likes to expand their intellectual horizon by learning a fascinating language such as Chinese.
