Prof. Da Hsuan Feng is a fellow of the American Physical Society and an expert in nuclear and nuclear astrophysics, quantum optics, and mathematical physics, with a wide range of experiences and outstanding achievements as a scholar, researcher and leader of university comprehensive development. Prof. Feng served as Vice President for Research and Graduate Education/Economic Development at the University of Texas at Dallas in 2000-2006, Senior Executive Vice President at Taiwan National Cheng Kung University in 2007-2011. Senior Vice President for Global Strategy, Planning and Evaluation, National Tsing Hua University in 2011-2014 and Global Affairs Director and Special Advisor to the Rector, University of Macau in 2014-2017

Abstract: In September and October 2013, President Xi Jinping unveiled for the world the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI.) In this talk, I will argue and discuss that three major outcomes with global implications and impact which can and will be resulted from this initiative. They are the formation of SUPERCONTINENT, the creation of a NEO-RENAISSANCE and China proactively engaging in a hitherto unprecedented CULTURAL COMMUNICATIONS with the outside world. All three are the result of the transformation of a millennium mindset of China and Chinese, without the BRI, they may not happen.
